## After a flood

If you have been affected by a flood, there are a number of things to be aware of when clearing up;

- Contact your insurance company and register your daim
- Take photos or videos and make a list of everything that has been damaged
- sharp objects so always wear protective clothing. Rood water could be contaminated or contain boots and rubber gloves when cleaning up.
- Find out how to dispose of flood damaged items safely, after you have spoken to your insurance company.
- Get your electricity checked by a qualified electrician before you turn it back on.
- tempted to agree to have work done by someone who appears at your door unannounced. Always pay in advance. Find a trader using the County use reputable building contractors and do not if your property has been damaged, don't be Council's Buy with Confidence scheme www.burwithconfidence.gov.uk Beware of rogue traders

## anywhere - are you prepared? Flooding can happen

One in six properties in England is at risk from flooding. Heavy rain has had a devastating impact where people have had to leave their homes and seen valuables destroyed by flood water.

## How to prepare for a flood

There are things you can do to reduce the impact of flooding by preparing in advance, such as:

- Have the correct home insurance policy in place.
- to a flood include emergency contact numbers. Write a simple plan of how you would respond essential documents, medication and belongings you would need if you had to evacuate.
- Prepare an emergency flood lot with items you may need if flooding means you can't access your house.
- help prevent blockages and localised flooding in Keep your drains and gutters clear of leaves to heavy rainfall.
- Make sure you know how to quiddy turn off your water, gas and electricity mains.
- Buying sandbags or other flood protection products might help but ched; government advice about www.gov.uk/prepare-for-a-flood how best to protect your home

# What to do during a flood

Rood water can rise quiddy, so always focus on the safety of yourself and your family before your property and be prepared to act quiddy. If there is an immediate risk to life or you are trapped by flood water call 999.

in the event of an emergency or severe flooding, ollow these steps to stay safe:

- Move your family and pets upstains, or to a high
  - Move important items and documents upstairs place with a means of escape
- Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies if or somewhere high and safe.
  - flood water is about to enter your home.
- DO NOT touch any electrical appliances or cables when standing in flood water.
- accommodation you can contact Cotswold District they can help. If you are unable to find alternative (if renting) as they may be able to provide you contact your friends and family to see whether If you are asked to evacuate your home, first uninsured or your landlord isn't able to help. contact your insurance provider or landlord with temporary accommodation, if you are Council on 01285 623000 for assistance.
