#### Update on Kempsford Quarry (Earthline)

The existing site is now closed for the winter and is all but completed. There are just a few relatively modest stockpiles of material on site, all the land east of the haul road is top soiled and available to the farmer. The land west of the haul road, adjacent to the unclassified highway, is all levelled and ready to take soil but this can't be concluded at this time of the year. Gloucestershire County Council have agreed this.

Some of the remaining land is intended to be used for plant and related activity as part of the planning application currently being prepared to extend sand and gravel extraction and restore the large lake using fill material if permission is granted. An Environmental Impact Assessment will accompany the application and include matters such as archaeology, ecology, water environment and noise.

#### A summary of the report from Gloucestershire County Council Transport Monitoring Team:

- A survey was carried out on Whelford Road between Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September and Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September 2014.
- The survey was carried out by mean of an Automatic Traffic Counter (ATC) pneumatic tube attached to the road surface. The degree of accuracy is estimated as within +/-2% for traffic flows, and within +/- 3% for overall speeds.
- The mean speed is the measurement used nationally in assessments for speed limits and is used within the report results for consistency. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed (the speed exceeded by only 15% of vehicles) was formerly used for this purpose and is included to facilitate comparison where previous data exists.
- Flows the figures given are the directional, 24hour flows
- Classification eleven vehicle classes have been collected from this survey and the results used to calculate the percentage HGV.

- Speeds The speed limit at site 10065 is 30mph. The average speed of traffic is above the speed limit in both directions with a mean speed of over 35mph northbound and over 37mph southbound.
- Traffic volume The total traffic volume of approximately 3,250 vehicles is an average for a weekday, calculated from one week of measurement. In general, traffic volumes are higher during the week than at the weekend.
- Classification The percentage of larger HGVs is just less than 3% of all traffic for each direction.

#### Whelford Traffic Survey – September 2014

In addition to the summary by Gloucestershire County Council on the previous page, Kevin Starling, a Whelford resident has analysed the data further.

It is clear from the graph below that traffic is at its peak when people are travelling to and from work. This is also the time when motorists exceed the speed limit most.



#### Other interesting facts -

- 20,587 vehicles travelled in both directions during the survey period.
- 5% (1029 vehicles) travelled at more than 52mph.
- 10% (2058 vehicles) travelled at more than 49mph.
- 15% travelled at more than 46mph.
- 25% travelled at more than 43mph.
- 50% travelled at more than 37mph.
- 61% travelled at more than 34.5mph (15% above the 30mph speed limit).
- Just over 17% (3,623 vehicles of the 20,587 total) were travelling within the speed limit of 30mph.
- Approximately two-thirds of all crashes in which people are killed or injured happen on roads with a speed limit of 30mph or less.
- The risk of a pedestrian who is hit by a car being killed increases slowly until impact speeds of around 30mph. Above this speed, the risk increases rapidly, so that a pedestrian who is hit by a car travelling at between 30mph and 40mph is between 3.5 and 5.5 times more likely to be killed if hit by a car travelling at below 30mph.

#### PLEASE WATCH YOUR SPEED



Six volunteers within the Parish have now been trained in the use of the appropriate speed measurement devices and in basic health and safety considerations when conducting speed checks at the roadside.

They will shortly be commencing checks under the guidance of our local Community Police Officers, before carrying out checks unaccompanied.

More volunteers have come forward and training sessions will be offered shortly.

## **ROYAL BRITISH LEGION POPPY APPEAL 2014**

The Government's health watchdog has been told by local people that the standard of care provided by a nursing service run by a volunteer service in the East Cotswolds is excellent.

The accolade has been bestowed by people questioned as part of the Care Quality Commission's inspection of the League of Friends of Fairford Hospital, which provides support to the NHS in Fairford, Lechlade and surrounding villages.

In their report on an inspection carried out recently they quote one person as saying: "The service means people can remain at home... It can mean the difference between meeting people's wishes to die at home or their having to go into hospital.

The inspectors were told by a local doctor that the League's service is able to provide the continuity that other services can struggle with, meeting the gaps and providing consistent and responsive care.

Said the League's chairman, Graham Hewitt: "We are naturally delighted the service has achieved a top ranking, which is due in large part to our excellent nursing team. We are grateful to them and to the community, which responds generously to all our fund-raising efforts."

#### Cotswold Careline provides reassurance for vulnerable residents this winter

Now that the clocks have gone back and winter fast approaches, Cotswold residents are being reminded that the Cotswold Careline emergency monitoring and contact service offers 24 hour support, 365 days a year to vulnerable members of the community.

The Careline service was founded by Forest of Dean Council in 2004. The service has an outstanding reputation and provides friendly professional support to residents across the Cotswold district from as little as 52p per day. Service users benefit from renewed independence and security without intrusion, allowing residents to remain in their own home. The service also provides extra peace of mind for family and friends.

The service can provide reassurance for the following:

- The elderly or disabled
- · Residents living alone and at risk of falling
- · Residents suffering from dementia, epilepsy, heart disease or who have suffered a stroke
- Residents with special needs or learning difficulties
- · Victims of domestic violence

The Careline itself is a slim alarm unit that sits by your own phone which links to a personal pendant that can be worn upon your wrist, clothing or on a chord around your neck. When pressed, the pendant raises a call for help and alerts our monitoring centre that you need assistance. The pendant is extremely effective and operates around the home and garden. The pendant range means that in the case of an incident the user does not have to worry about getting to the telephone or remembering telephone numbers.

Cotswold Careline offers a friendly, professional, low cost 24 hour service, which provides immediate reassurance through the dark winter months. The simple body worn pendant gives peace of mind and allows the wearer to continue living independently in their own home. Installation of the Careline is so quick and easy that new users often tell us that they wished they had it installed years ago.

Apparently, some service users are often worried that they might press the red button on their body worn pendant by mistake, causing embarrassment to themselves and an inconvenience to the person on the other end of the line. This is a myth and service users are encouraged to press their red button regularly to ensure the equipment is working effectively and the operator on the other end of the line can have a friendly chat with the user to check their wellbeing.
