Who we are

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament. We are not part of government or any political party. We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.

Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority. A local authority's electoral arrangements are:

 The total number of councillors representing the council's voters ('council size').

The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.

 The number of councillors representing each ward or division.

Why Cotswold?

We are conducting an electoral review of Cotswold District Council following a request from the council for a single-member ward review.

Cotswold District Council formally asked the Commission to undertake an electoral review of the district with a view to delivering electoral arrangements that mean each ward is represented by one councillor.

Our proposals

Cotswold District Council currently has 44 councillors. Based on the evidence we received during previous phases of the review, the Commission recommends that 34 councillors should serve the district in future.

Electoral arrangements

Our final recommendations propose that Cotswold's 34 councillors should represent 30 single-member wards and two two-member wards.

The Commission believes the final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:

- Deliver electoral equality for voters.
- Reflect local community interests and identities.

 Promote effective and convenient local government.

Volunteers help relieve a social time-bomb

At a time when the country is facing a social time-bomb, the nation is turning increasingly to voluntary effort to ease the pressure on the National Health Service. As people grow older, they increasingly adopt ailments such as loss of memory which are best treated in the community, among their friends and neighbours.

Already helping serve this need with its Edna Dawes Lunch Club, Fairford Hospital League of Friends is now supporting a community interest company, Memory Club UK, in providing the Young at Heart Lunch Club. It meets at Fairford Community Centre on the third Tuesday of each month from 12.30 to 4.30pm to provide support and companionship, not to mention a meal and some fun for its guests.

It has been operational for some months now, but welcomes visitors who feel they could benefit from the advice and activities available within its membership, which is priced at $\pounds 3.50$ per session.

People who have warmed to the club's services include a lady who we will call Mrs Smith to protect her identity. Her daughter contacted her GP because she was worried that her mum had no social interaction and no longer enjoyed hobbies that she had once loved. The daughter feared Mrs Smith would probably make excuses and not come along to the club, so it was arranged that she would be picked up.

Now Mrs Smith comes to the club regularly and enjoys the social interaction, baking, arts and crafts and has a home-cooked meal, also a concern with her daughter who feared her mum wasn't eating. It transpired her carers were providing meals with meat and she was a vegetarian.

Mrs Smith's daughter and the GP have seen a significant improvement in her mood and motivation and thanked the club for its service.

An elderly gentleman who has been welcomed to the club was in his element when the organisers, who learned he had been a baker, laid on a baking session for him and now he is thoroughly enjoying himself as he extends his repertoire with fairy cakes, jam puffs, chocolate muffins and cheese puffs.

Said League of Friends chairman Graham Hewitt: " It is amazing what can be done with a kind word and a little understanding. Today the NHS has to perform tasks it was never designed for. If the community can help with simple care such as that provided by organisations such as Memory Clubs UK, and numerous other volunteers, we were all winners – the NHS because there is less need for hospitalisation, the patients and the people who care for them who much prefer a community solution. We hope many more people will choose to support Memory Clubs both as users and carers."
