The Parish Council is grateful to Aggregate Industries for arranging the cycleway to be swept. Unfortunately it cannot be done using a normal road sweeper due to weight and size limits and there is no provision within the County Councils regular road maintenance scheme to do so.

New sports facilities at Top Road/Hazel View

The grass pitch has improved significantly over the last few months and we hope that it will be open for use very shortly. The Parish Council, together with the District and County Council, will be meeting with the developers this month to discuss the preparation of handover.

There has been complaints of the field being used by residents to exercise their dogs and fouling. Signs will be erected shortly stating that 'NO DOGS' are allowed, but in the meantime if you spot and recognise people using the pitch to exercise their dogs, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Housing Needs Survey

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete and return the recent Housing Needs Survey. We received a response rate of 41% with 196 completed from 483 dwellings. A draft report has been presented to the Parish Council, and the final report will be published shortly on our website.

Airfield Activity at RAF Fairford beginning August 2017

RAF Fairford is home to the USAF 420th Air Base Squadron, which is part of the 501st Combat Support Wing at RAF Alconbury in Cambridgeshire. The base is maintained in a ready, "warm status" by a civilian workforce who are responsible for all daily tasks and contingency preparations.

The main mission at RAF Fairford is to be ready to receive a deployment of aircraft and personnel for real-world scenarios and for training.

RAF Fairford serves as the United States' primary forward operating location for heavy bombers in Europe, and as such, plays a key role in the combined exercises that allow the U.S. Air Force to build the enduring relationships necessary to confront a broad range of global challenges.

In recent months, RAF Fairford has hosted US Air Force Global Strike Command strategic bombers, in order for them to participate in NATO and European exercises. These exercises saw deployed Airmen work alongside more than 20 partner nations and provided opportunities to enhance interoperability, and to provide important integration with UK and NATO partners.

The base will be active again in the forthcoming weeks, when RAF Fairford will again host U.S. Air Force aircraft and Airmen, beginning in mid-August. During this time, you will again notice a greater U.S. Air Force presence, with a temporary increase in U.S. personnel at RAF Fairford.

To protect operational security, we are unable to discuss any details regarding aircraft activities. Flight operations will adhere to the posted quiet hours wherever possible (Monday to Thursday 23:00 each evening to 06:00 the following morning, and weekends from 18:00 Friday evening until 06:00 Monday morning), however conditions may necessitate some flying activity outside of the established quiet hours.

We understand the importance of communication with the local community, and will pass on information when available within the restrictions of operational security. Installation of New Defibrillators in Kempford Parish

As part of a Cotswold District programme being undertaken with the support of the South West Ambulance Service Foundation Trust (SWASFT) and with the generous support of the Gresham-Wells Trustees (The Parish Council), Kempford Parish now has three new Community Public Access Defibrillators (CPAD) distributed across the Parish. This will significantly improve access to these important life-saving pieces of equipment across the Parish which until now had only one, located at The George in Kempford.

What are they for?

When someone suffers a cardiac arrest, the heart stops and blood is no longer being pumped around the body. The longer they go without emergency life-support, the harder it is to restart their heart. Prompt action is required to deal with this.

A defibrillator is a machine used to give an electric shock to restart a patient's heart. **Access to a nearby defibrillator will allow more people to get the life-saving shock as quickly as possible, giving them the best chance of survival.**



Awareness Sessions

Want to know what is in the box and how to use it?

The first two PAD Awareness Sessions are being arranged for October in the Kempsford and Whelford Village Halls. A further one will be arranged early in the New Year if there is the interest.

The sessions will aim to familiarise those attending with what is in the box and how to use it to provide basic life support to a patient.

The sessions are open to anyone locally who wants to attend, although it is hoped that local community groups will make every effort to ensure they are represented.

Where are they?

Defibrillators, placed within distinctive bright yellow boxes, are now located at:

- Dunfield Telephone Box
- Whelford Village Hall
- Kempsford Village Hall
- The George, Kempsford

Want to do more?

Community First Responders (CFR) are volunteers who support their local community by attending emergency calls ahead of an Ambulance.

CFRs are trained to attend medical emergencies where it might be essential for the patient to receive immediate life-saving care. No previous medical training is needed to become a CFR.

CFRs are an integral part of the local Ambulance Service. Before appointment and issue of equipment, volunteers will be expected to have completed an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service check and will receive training, including a day “on-shift” with a crew.

The local group, which covers an area from Lechlade through Fairford to Kempsford and the surrounding areas, meets monthly. Local CFRs are encouraged to attend these as part of their continuation training.

If your call is deemed to be an appropriate emergency situation, you will be given the location of the nearest defibrillator and (if needed) the access code for the box. Ambulance call handling staff will also provide additional support and instructions as appropriate.

A Recent Query at Citizens Advice Cotswold District

I'm planning a long holiday and have been struggling to find travel insurance for a reasonable price. I've found a good deal from a Facebook advert but my friend thinks it might be a scam. How can I be sure if it's legitimate?

Your friend is right to raise the possibility that it might be a scam and you should do some research on the company before making a purchase. Insurance is a financial product and the seller must be registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). Check they're listed on the financial watchdog's register which can be viewed on its [website](#). If they're not named, take your business to a different provider as the seller will not be legitimate. If they are listed, it's still worth doing further checks on them.

A good starting point is comparing the price of the insurance deal with similar offers from competitors. Big discounts are often a tell-tale sign of a scam, but it could also be that the policy is cheap because it doesn't provide adequate cover.

Ask for a copy of the full policy so you can check it against where you're going and what you're doing. If the seller won't provide one, or says they will only give it to you it after you've paid, don't give them your business.

Once you know the seller is legitimate use a secure payment method, such as a money transfer service like PayPal, to pay for the insurance. Don't pay with a bank transfer, and don't go ahead with the deal if they ask you to.
